Father, you confirm the true faith with the crown of martyrdom. May the prayers of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More give us the courage to proclaim our faith by the witness of our lives. Tuesday Saint Etheldreda

Etheldreda was a woman from the seventh century who was dedicated to her faith. Despite two marriages, she chose to become a nun and founded a monastery on the Isle of Ely, which became the second richest abbey in England after Glastonbury.

Wednesday Nativity of St. John the Baptist

This feast day celebrates the birth of St John the Baptist, a prophet who foretold the coming of the Messiah in the person of Jesus. His parents were faithful to God, his father Zechariah was told by the Angel Gabriel that they would have a son despite his wife's age. He remained faithful and followed the orders the angel set, that they must name their son John. John would go on to be an important martyr who baptised Jesus. Prayer:
