



## **Return to school Information**

- Students return to school on **Thursday 11th March** for lessons.
- **Students will return to school in week B**
- Students are expected to be in school every day, unless they received a letter identifying them as Clinically Extremely Vulnerable and are therefore shielding.  
Please contact the school via [admin@allhallows.net](mailto:admin@allhallows.net) if this applies to your child.
- Should your child display symptoms of COVID 19 please follow the Government guidelines, remain at home, and arrange a PCR test. For more information, [please refer to COVID information on our website.](#)
- If your child tests positive for COVID 19 please inform the school as soon as possible.

**Many of our procedures will remain unchanged for students, from the Autumn term.** These include:

- Use of indoor and outdoor zones
- Practical lessons in practical rooms with cleaning between year groups
- PE lessons continue in line with sport specific guidance
- Sanitiser in classrooms and food areas
- Toilets allocated to maximum of two year groups
- Toilets are cleaned regularly during the day.
- Reduced visitors on school site, only with prearranged meeting.
- Front Office unable to receive items for students e.g. forgotten PE kit
- Timings of the school day; 850am Start of Lesson 1, and staggered end of day
- Breakfast available in outdoor zones from 830am; No break time provision; Grab and Go hot food available at lunch time
- Homework set on MS Teams and written in school journal
- Homework detentions hosted in zone areas (resume from 22<sup>nd</sup> March)
- Extra-curricular clubs on hold until further notice
- Full bus service in operation
- Parents Evenings will be hosted remotely via SchoolCloud

**However, some of our procedures will be slightly different to accommodate changes in the Government guidance. These include:**

### Face Coverings

- Students and staff are required to wear face coverings in all indoor environments (including classrooms, during lessons) when social distancing cannot be maintained. There are exemptions (such as pupils who rely on visual signals for communication).
- Students will be required to wear face coverings in outdoor queues, such as for the restaurant.
- If any student does not have a face covering with them, a disposable mask will be provided.

### Buses

- Students who are getting buses will need to go to the **middle** playground at the end of the day.
- [Stagecoach have asked us to remind you that students are required to wear face coverings for their journeys to and from school](#) and they are running an exact-fare scheme so no change will be given on the bus. We will be asking them to wear their masks whilst they are waiting for the bus.

## **Back-to-school Reminders**

### **Equipment**

- We are unable to lend equipment to students.
- Students need to ensure that they have the following items with them every day;
  - pen and spare pen (blue and black ink),
  - scientific calculator,
  - ruler (15cm or 30cm),
  - rubber,
  - sharpener.
  - colouring pencils,
  - highlighter,
  - whiteboard pen,
  - glue stick,
  - scissors,
  - compasses, and
  - a protractor.

### **Uniform**

- Students are required to be in full uniform from Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> March.
- We encourage all students to bring a coat to school for their comfort at break and lunch times.
- Now that the weather is milder, hoodies and non-uniform jumpers will no longer be permitted.
- Students may bring in their mobile phone, however it must stay in their bag on 'silent' at all times and remains the responsibility of the student.
