**World Book Day: Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2022**

This year at All Hallows, we are proud to be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March with two special events for students in Year 7 and Year 8.

Firstly, we would like to offer students the opportunity to dress up as a character from a book for the day. Each tutor group has been allocated a particular book shown in the table below and students need to choose a character from that book to dress as. Please note, that costumes need to be appropriate and suitable for wearing throughout the normal school day and your child will need to bring all their usual books and equipment, including PE kit if applicable. Dressing up is entirely optional if your child does not wish to participate, they should come to school in their normal school uniform.

The teacher will note the student's name and donation. On Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March, students will be invited to the Book Market where they will be able to choose a new book to take home.

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In addition to these two events, there will be various other whole-school activities in which we would encourage all students to participate. These include a competition to design a new book mark and various book-related activities around the school on World Book Day itself.
